Faith's budget serves as a financial guide to accomplish the mission God has given our church to know Christ, grow together, serve others, and go to our neighbors and the nations with the Gospel of Jesus.

Our elders have prayerfully considered all that God has called us to do in the coming year and developed a detailed budget which is summarized on this document. This year's proposed budget reflects a 24.7% increase over 2022-2023 with the goal of eliminating Faith's debt by our loan maturation in June 2025. PROPOSED BUDGET ALLOCATION

13.4% FAITH MINISTRY

This figure includes the specific needs of each ministry area's part in our mission (e.g., Next Gen Ministry, Men's Ministry, Women's Ministry, Care & Counseling, Food Pantry, and Discipleship Classes).

6.9% FAITH GIVING

This figure includes our financial support of Faith Baptist Church missionaries, church planters, church revitalizations, denominational partnerships (e.g., Southern Baptist Convention, Baptist State Convention of NC, and Tar River Baptist Association), Southern Baptist missionaries (through the International Mission Board and North American Mission Board), and local partners for the advance of our mission (e.g., Pillar Network, and Southeastern Seminary).

51.0% FAITH STAFF

This figure includes the salaries and benefits of the individuals who are vocationally employed at Faith to equip and lead us to accomplish our mission as a church.

11.7% FAITH OPERATIONS

This figure includes planned capital improvements, the administrative systems, as well as the operational and maintenance expenses of our campus and organization. God has entrusted us with the stewardship of our facility for His glory.

17.0% DEBT SERVICE

This figure includes scheduled and supplemental principal and interest payments on our mortgage loan.

In addition to the proposed budget and Board of Directors found on the reverse side, Faith members in attendance at the **Members Meeting on August 20 at 6:30 PM** will have the opportunity to affirm twelve candidates for the position of deacon.

Deacon Role & Candidates

The church will recognize and elect members as deacons who are giving of themselves in service to the church, and who possess particular gifts of service. These members will be received as gifts of Christ to His church and set apart as deacons.

The qualifications for a deacon are set forth in Acts 6:1-6 and 1 Timothy 3:8-13. Deacons are to serve under the direction of the elders undertaking those areas of service necessary for the church's functioning that would otherwise prohibit the elders and other leaders (pastors and staff) from performing their biblical responsibilities. No specific, on-going roles are mentioned in Scripture, probably because service needs change, and so the role of the deacon should be flexible.
