Look, the days are coming—this is the Lord's declaration—when the plowman will overtake the reaper and the one who treads grapes, the sower of seed. The mountains will drip with sweet wine, and all the hills will flow with it. I will restore the fortunes of my people Israel. They will rebuild and occupy ruined cities, plant vineyards and drink their wine, make gardens and eat their produce. I will plant them on their land, and they will never again be uprooted from the land I have given them. The Lord your God has spoken."

Amos is from Tekoa in the Southern Kingdom, approximately 6 miles south of Bethlehem (1:1). He was a shepherd who also took care of sycamore figs (7:14). Amos was called by God to prophecy judgment against three groups of people: 1) the surrounding nations for their sins against humanity, 2) the Southern Kingdom for neglecting God's laws, and 3) the Northern Kingdom for their moral and spiritual decay. The poor were being abused for legal economic exploitation (slavery accepted). All 12 tribes of Israel were very religious but none of their "religious" practices were acceptable to God.
