MESSAGE

Ecclesiastes examines the futility of "life under the sun" (1:14), which is the author's way of addressing the human experience in a fallen world. Ecclesiastes demonstrates the emptiness of life apart from the fear of the Lord, and serves as a reminder that the pursuit of God and His ways is the only way to experience joy and purpose in this life (12:13).

KEY THEMES

- The world is corrupted by sin, and as a result this life can feel toilsome and empty.
- Joy is not found in relationships, finances, or status.
- God encourages us to enjoy life and His good creation.
- True joy and purpose can only be found by knowing the Lord and keeping His commandments.



The author is identified as the "Teacher (or preacher), the son of David" (1:1). While the identity of this teacher is technically not revealed, Solomon has traditionally been viewed as the author of Ecclesiastes
