Psalms means "songs", or "praise songs". Many of the psalms were used as songs that the people of God would sing in the worship services of Israel; hence it is often referred to as a hymn book.

The Book of Psalms is written by multiple authors across a period of roughly a thousand years in Israel's history.

A few psalms are attributed to king Solomon. One is a prayer assigned to Moses. Another group of 12 psalms is ascribed to a worship director by the name of Asaph. David is responsible for nearly half of the psalms (73).
